Report on Online Education survey in Haryana

Online education survey was conducted by the volunteers of Haryana Gyan Vigyan Samiti in Haryana w.e.f. August 21, 2021 to August 26, 2021 in twelve districts using random sampling. In total 1071 forms were filled. And the questionnaire was divided into six subsections as mentioned below:

- 2. Detail of student
- 3. Details about the academic profile of student during online study
- 4. Online education
- 5. Offline education (If any)
- 6. Views of parents on online education and knowledge level of their ward (child)
